CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES UPDATE

Construction Activity No. 1:

Nighttime Lane Closures on SR-953/LeJeune Road (NW 42nd Avenue) between SR-836 and NW 21 Street:

Commencing Monday, November 8th, 2004 through Sunday, November 14, 2004: As part of the Miami Intermodal Center Program, there will be nightly lane closures from 11:00 PM TO 5:30 AM on SR-953/LeJeune Road between SR-836 and NW 21st Street. Two northbound lanes will be closed for utility relocation work. Traffic from the SR-836 Exit Ramp onto Northbound LeJeune Road will be shifted to allow motorists to merge into the single open lane on LeJeune Road. This work is being performed by Florida Power & Light (FP&L).

Construction Activity No. 2:

Lane Shifts at the Entrance/Exit of Tri-Rail's Miami Airport Station Located at NW 21st Street and NW 38th Avenue:

(Change from original date of November 8, 2004 through November 22, 2004)

Commencing Monday, November 15, 2004 through Monday, November 29, 2004: Motorists are urged to use caution when entering or exiting the Tri-Rail Parking Lot on N.W. 21 Street as entrance and exit lanes will be narrowed and shifted due to construction work adjacent to those lanes. These lane shifts are required for remedial activities in association with the development of the Miami Intermodal Center (MIC). The entrances to the Tri-Rail parking lots will remain accessible to the public. This work is being performed by WRS Infrastructure & Environment, Inc. on behalf of the Florida Department of Transportation.

*Nearby business interests and residents affected by construction of the **Miami Intermodal Center** and other nearby construction projects will receive periodic Maintenance of Traffic (MOT) bulletins giving road closure information and suggesting alternate routes. This information is being provided by the **One Stop Shop Traffic Information Program** sponsored by the **Florida Department of Transportation** and its partnering agencies Miami-Dade County, Miami-Dade Aviation Department, Miami International Airport, Miami-Dade Expressway Authority, Tri-Rail, Miami-Dade Transit, Miami-Dade Office of Public Transportation Management, Cities of Miami, Hialeah, Miami Springs and Virginia Gardens, and local Utilities.
