CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES UPDATE

Construction Activity No. 1

Temporary Ramp Closure for Westbound SR-836 Off-Ramp at NW 37th Avenue and Lane Closure at NW 37th Avenue (Douglas Road) from NW 13th Street to North of NW 14th Street:

Commencing Friday, September 19, 2003 until Monday, September 22, 2003: The westbound SR-836 exit ramp on NW 37th Avenue will be temporarily closed from Friday, September 19, 2003 at 8:00 p.m. until Monday, September 22, 2003 at 5:30 a.m. Motorist on Westbound SR-836 should keep right and use the next exit on NW 42nd Avenue (LeJeune Road). Variable Message Signs (VMS) will be located on the westbound of SR-836 to detour traffic. In addition, the right northbound lane along NW 37th Avenue (Douglas Road) from NW 13th Street to North of NW 14th Street Intersection will be temporarily closed. One northbound lane will be open to traffic. Crew working hours will be from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. during the weekend only. From Monday, September 22, 2003 to Friday, September 26, 2003: During weekdays, two southbound lanes and one northbound lane will be open to traffic on NW 37th Avenue (Douglas Road) from NW 13th Street to North of NW 14th Street. The lane and ramp closures are due to drainage and roadway improvements along this intersection. This activity will be performed by APAC Construction for FDOT. An off-duty police officer will be on site and VMS signs will be in place advising commuters of detours and lane closures. This closure will occur again on Friday, September 26, 2003 until Monday, September 29, 2003.

Construction Activity No. 2

Intersection of NW 37th Avenue (Douglas Road) and NW 21st Street:

Commencing Friday, September 19, 2003 until Monday, September 22, 2003: The south side of the intersection of NW 37th Avenue and NW 21st Street will be temporarily closed. One lane in each direction will remain open. Lane closures will be in effect throughout the weekend from Friday, September 19, 2003 at 9:00 p.m. until Monday, September 22, 2003, at 5:30 a.m. This closure is due the installation of a watermain pipe for the MIC Rental Car Facility. Work is being performed by Turner Construction (Central Florida Equipment).

Construction Activity No. 3

NW 14th Street approximately 200 feet East of NW 37th Avenue
Friday, September 19, 2003 from 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.: The outermost lanes along NW 14th Street approximately 200 feet east of NW 37th Avenue will be temporarily closed from 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. This closure is due to the removal of two light poles at this location. A new light fixture will be mounted on the existing light pole on the south side of NW 14th Street. Work is being performed by Florida Power and Light.

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Construction Activity No. 4

NW 21st Street from NW 37th Avenue to NW 39th Avenue

Commencing Monday, September 22, 2003 through Friday, October 10, 2003: The left westbound and left eastbound lanes including the center turning lanes along NW 21st Street from NW 37th Avenue to approximately 400 feet west of NW 37th Avenue will be temporarily closed. At least one lane in each direction will be maintained open to traffic. This closure is due the installation of a watermain pipe for the MIC Rental Car Facility. Crew working hours will be during non-peak hours from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Work is being performed by Turner Construction (Central Florida Utilities). Variable Message Signs will be in place advising commuters of lane closures.

Nearby business interests and residents affected by construction of the Miami Intermodal Center and other nearby construction projects will receive periodic Maintenance of Traffic (MOT) bulletins giving road closure information and suggesting alternate routes. This information is being provided by the One Stop Shop Traffic Information Program sponsored by the Florida Department of Transportation and its partnering agencies Miami-Dade County, Miami-Dade Aviation Department, Miami International Airport, Miami-Dade Expressway Authority, Tri-Rail, Miami-Dade Transit, Miami-Dade Office of Public Transportation Management, Cities of Miami, Hialeah, Miami Springs and Virginia Gardens, and local Utilities. Thank you for your patience while we work to improve the roadways in this area.
