CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES UPDATE

Intersection of NW 25th Street and NW 38th Court – Westbound Lane Closure:

Commencing Friday, October 3, 2003 until Monday, October 6, 2003: The intersection of NW 25th Street and NW 38th Court will be partially closed. The westbound lane will be closed from **Friday, October 3, 2003 at 9:00 p.m. to Monday, October 6, 2003 at 5:30 a.m.** Two-way traffic will be maintained utilizing flag persons and traffic will be diverted around the work zone. Commuters should follow construction signs. The lane closure is due to the installation of an underground electrical system for the Miami Intermodal Center's Rental Car Facility. This work will be performed by FPL Distribution (Carolina Conduit System, Inc).

NW 21st Street from NW 37th Avenue to NW 39th Avenue:

Construction along NW 21st Street is on schedule and will continue through Sunday, October 19, 2003: The left westbound and left eastbound lanes including the center turning lanes along NW 21st Street from NW 37th Avenue to approximately 400 feet west of NW 37th Avenue will be temporarily closed. At least one lane in each direction will be maintained open to traffic. Access into and out of the properties located along the north and south sides of NW 21st Street will be restricted to right turns only. All other traffic will be detoured through alternative routes as shown on the attached Detour Map. This closure is due the installation of a water main pipe for the MIC Rental Car Facility. Work is being performed by Turner Construction (Central Florida Utilities). Variable Message Signs (VMS) will be in place advising commuters of lane closures.

Temporary Ramp Closure for Westbound SR-836 Off-Ramp at NW 37th Avenue and Full Lane Closures at NW 14th Street (Frontage Road) from NW 36th Avenue to NW 37th Avenue (Douglas Road):

Commencing Friday, October 3, 2003 at 8:00 p.m. until Monday, October 6, 2003 at 5:30 a.m.: (Weekend Work) The westbound SR-836 exit ramp on NW 37th Avenue will be temporarily closed. Motorist on Westbound SR-836 should keep right and use the next exit on NW 42nd Avenue (LeJeune Road). Variable Message Signs (VMS) will be located on westbound SR-836 to detour traffic. In addition, NW 14th Street (Frontage Road) from NW 36th Avenue to NW 37th Avenue (Douglas Road) will be temporary closed to thru traffic. Access will be maintained for local traffic only. In conjunction with this closure, the two northbound lanes along NW 37th Avenue (Douglas Road), from NW 13th street to north of NW 14th street, will be temporarily closed. Northbound traffic will be shifted to the southbound lanes. One lane in each direction will be open to traffic. The southbound left turn along NW 37th Avenue onto the SR-836 East Ramp will also be temporarily closed. Commuters should follow detour route to NW 42nd Avenue (LeJeune Road) to go East on SR-836. **(Weekday Work): From Monday, October 6, 2003 until Friday, October 10, 2003:** During weekdays, two southbound lanes and one northbound lane will be open to traffic on NW 37th Avenue (Douglas Road) from NW 13th Street to North of NW 14th Street. The lane and ramp closures are due to drainage and roadway improvements along this intersection. **Crew working hours will be from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.** This activity will be performed by APAC Construction for FDOT. An off-duty police officer will be on site and VMS signs will be in place advising commuters of detours and lane closures.

*Nearby business interests and residents affected by construction of the **Miami Intermodal Center** and other nearby construction projects will receive periodic Maintenance of Traffic (MOT) bulletins giving road closure information and suggesting alternate routes. This information is being provided by the **One Stop Shop Traffic Information Program** sponsored by the **Florida Department of Transportation** and its partnering agencies Miami-Dade County, Miami-Dade Aviation Department, Miami International Airport, Miami-Dade Expressway Authority, Tri-Rail, Miami-Dade Transit, Miami-Dade Office of Public Transportation Management, Cities of Miami, Hialeah, Miami Springs and Virginia Gardens, and local Utilities. Thank you for your patience while we work to improve the roadways in this area.
