NW 21 Street from NW 37 Avenue (Douglas Road) to NW 38 Court:

Monday, April 30 through Friday, May 11 – One westbound lane on NW 21 Street between NW 37 Avenue and NW 38 Court will close between the hours of **7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.** One travel lane will remain open at all times. Crews need to close the lane to construct a new turn lane into the rail station and new median in the middle of NW 21st Street. Work will be performed by Turner Construction on behalf of the Florida Department of Transportation.

NW 25 Street from east of NW 38 Court to NW 37 Avenue:

Tuesday, May 1 through Friday, May 4 – One eastbound lane on NW 25 Street beginning just east of NW 38 Court to NW 37 Avenue will close between the hours of **7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.** One travel lane will remain open at all times. Crews need to close the lane to install a new sanitary sewer line. Work will be performed by Turner Construction on behalf of the Florida Department of Transportation.

Full Closure of NW 25 Street from NW 38 Court to NW 37 Avenue (Douglas Road):

Beginning Friday, May 4 at 9 p.m. through Monday, May 7 at 5:30 a.m. – NW 25th Street will be completely closed between NW 38 Court and NW 37 Avenue. Drivers who wish to use this road will be detoured as follows:

Detour: Northbound drivers on NW 37 Avenue will be guided as follows:

- Continue North to NW 28 Street
- Turn right on NW 28 Street
- Turn left on S. River Drive
- Turn left on NW 31 Street
- Turn left on NW 42 Avenue (LeJeune Road)
- Turn left on NW 25 Street

Eastbound drivers on NW 25 Street will be guided as follows:

- Turn left on NW 39 Avenue
- Turn left on NW 27 Street
- Turn right on NW 42 Avenue (LeJeune Road)
- Turn right on NW 31 Street
- Turn right on S. River Drive
- Turn right on NW 25 Street

Crews need to close the roadway to install new sanitary sewer laterals which will serve the future Miami Central Station (MCS).

Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions. Motorists are encouraged to call 511 before they drive, or log on to www.fl511.com to get real-time traffic and lane closure information.

The Miami Central Station (MCS) is a major structure of the Miami Intermodal Center (MIC) Program that will serve as Miami-Dade County's first ground transportation hub.
